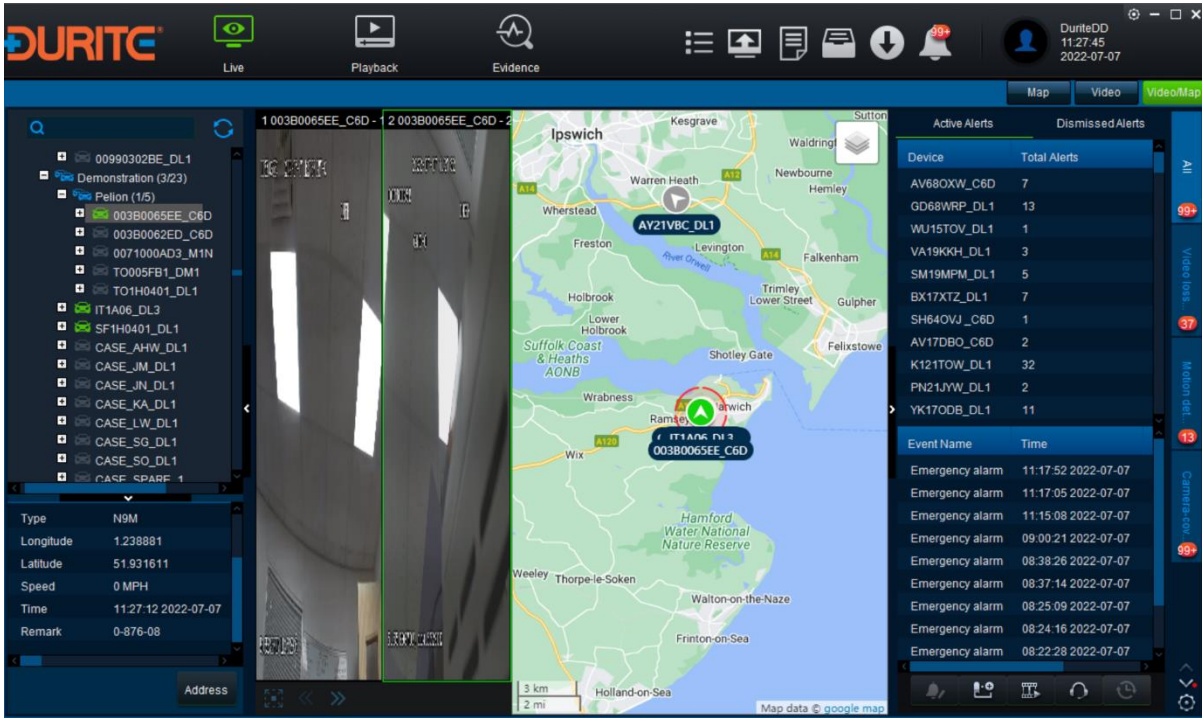
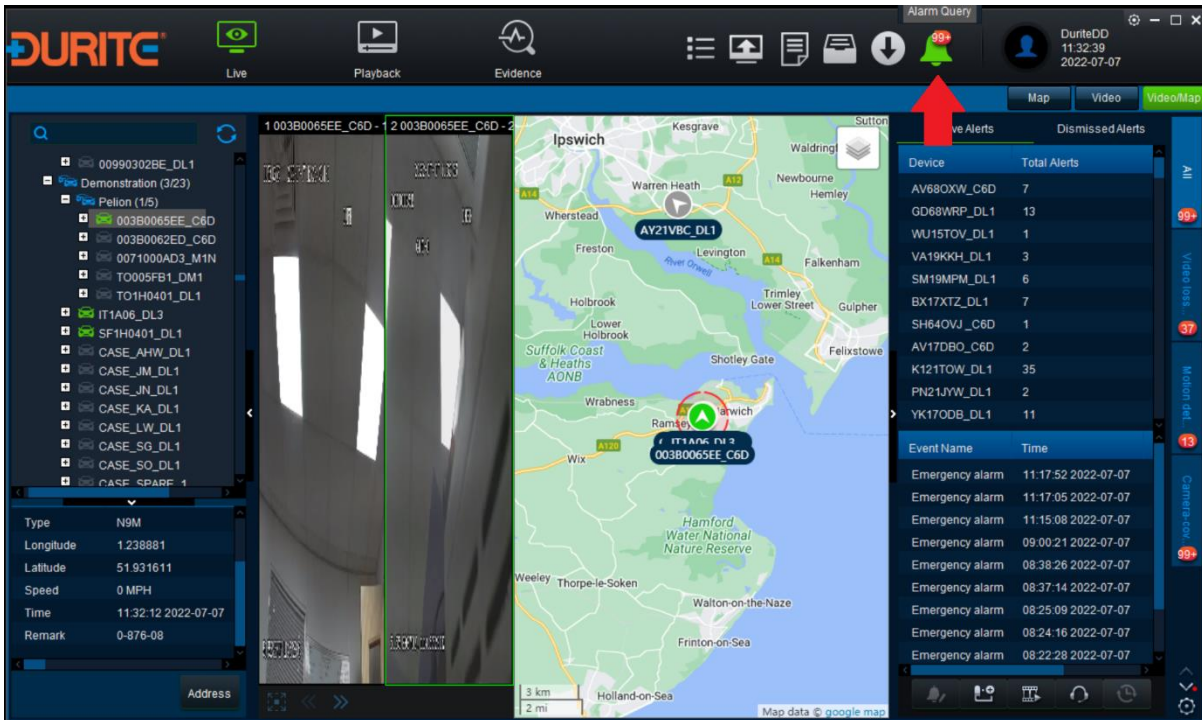


Setting up Panic Button Email Alerts on 4G Dash Cam

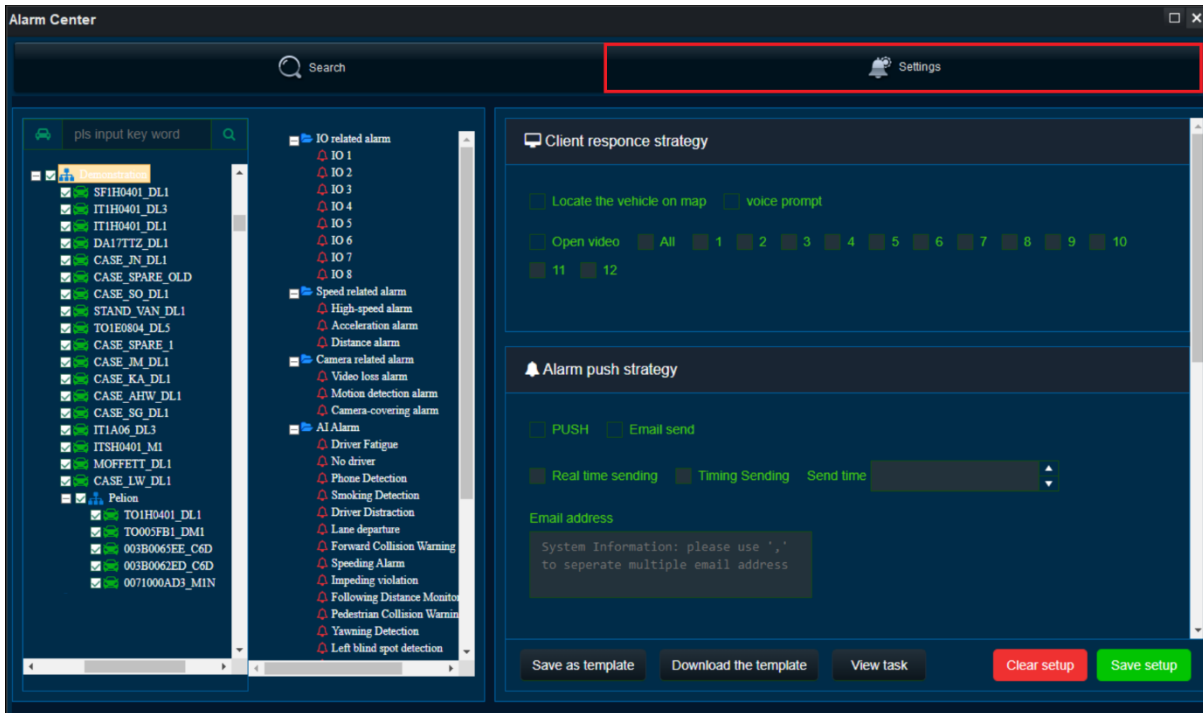
1. Start from the Main screen on Durite Live.



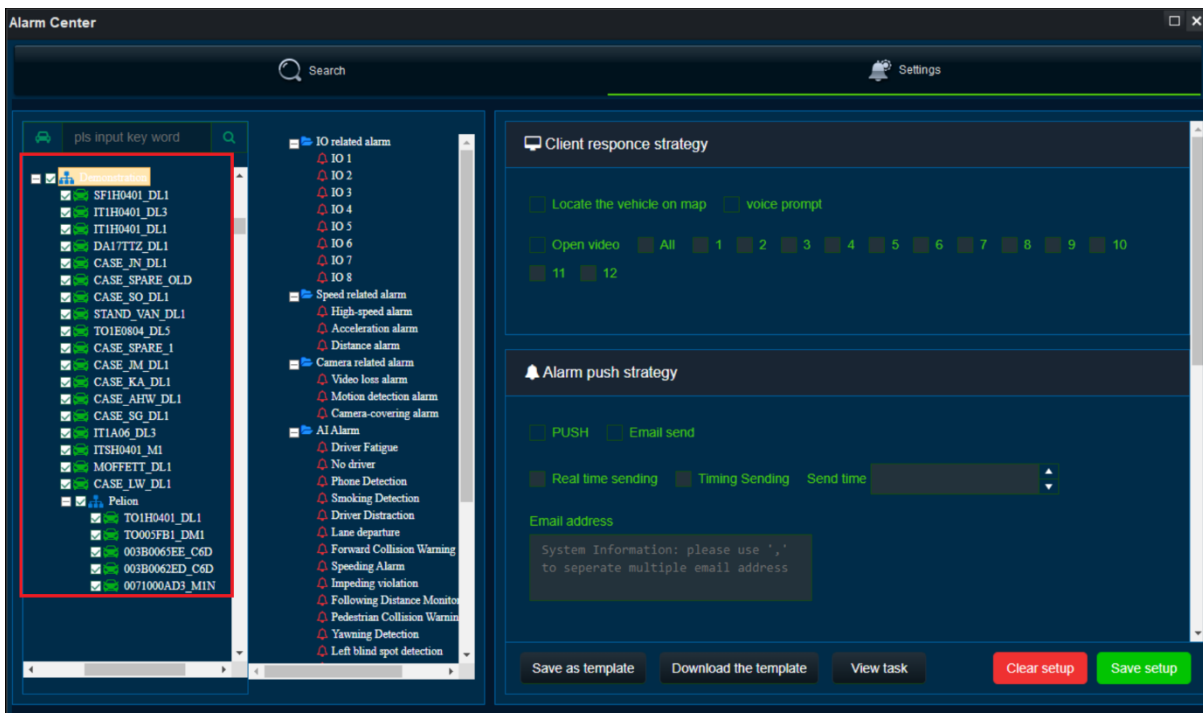
2. Select the Alarm Query tab as shown by the Red Arrow.



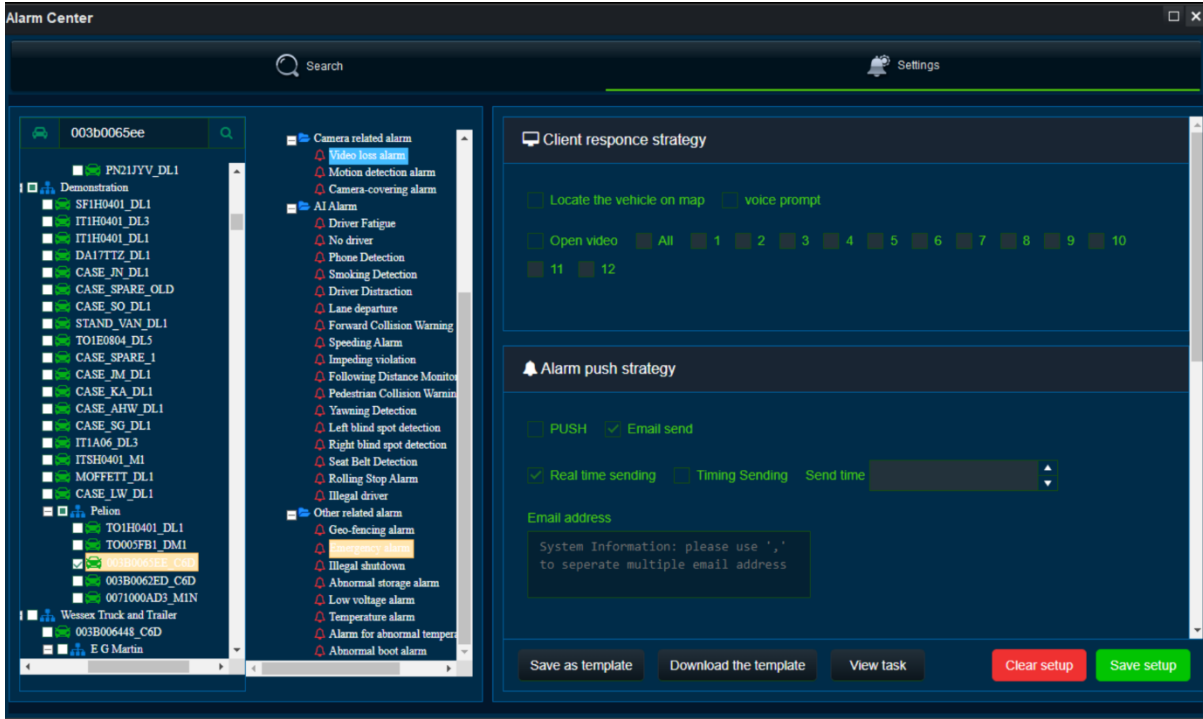
3. Now Select the Settings in the Alarm Center.



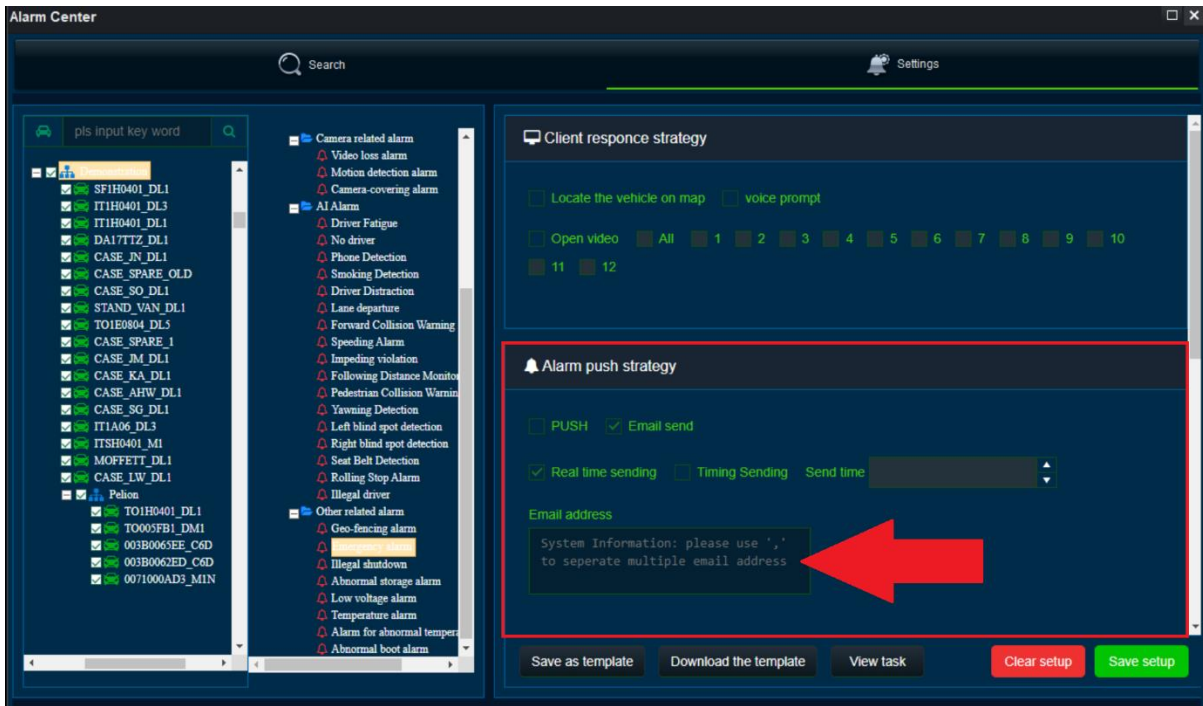
4. In this highlighted box you can select which vehicles you want to set the email alerts up for you can select the whole fleet or individual vehicles by ticking the ones required.



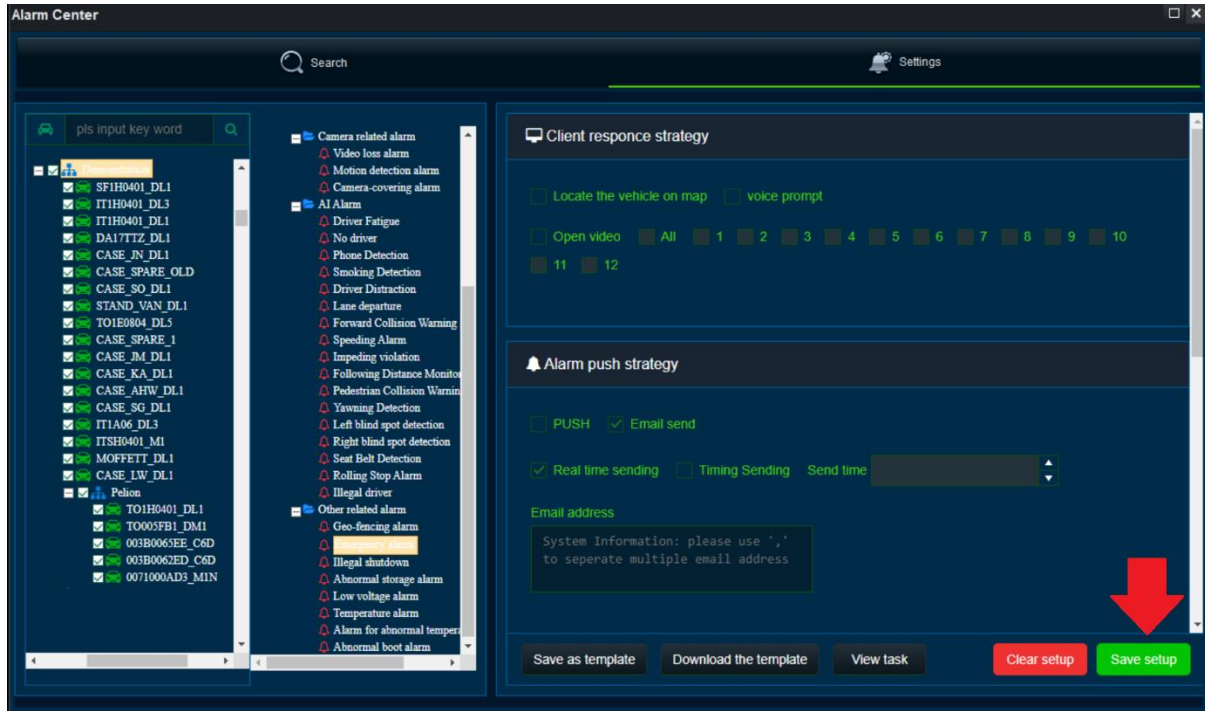
- The Below example is for setting 1 vehicle to the Panic button alarm (Emergency Alarm) under the other related alarms tab (this device already has a video loss alarm set which is why that alarm is also highlighted).



- In this box you can set the alarm push features so for email alerts when the Panic button is pressed. So this is set to email in real time when the panic button is pressed. Where the arrow is enter the email address the alerts are to be sent to you can send to multiple email addresses.



- Once you have filled the details in on the alarm center press the save setup button at bottom of the screen.



- Here is an example of the email alert received when the panic button has been pressed on one of our test units. Using these email alerts alongside the Durite Live software will make it easier to locate and download any footage required from an incident.

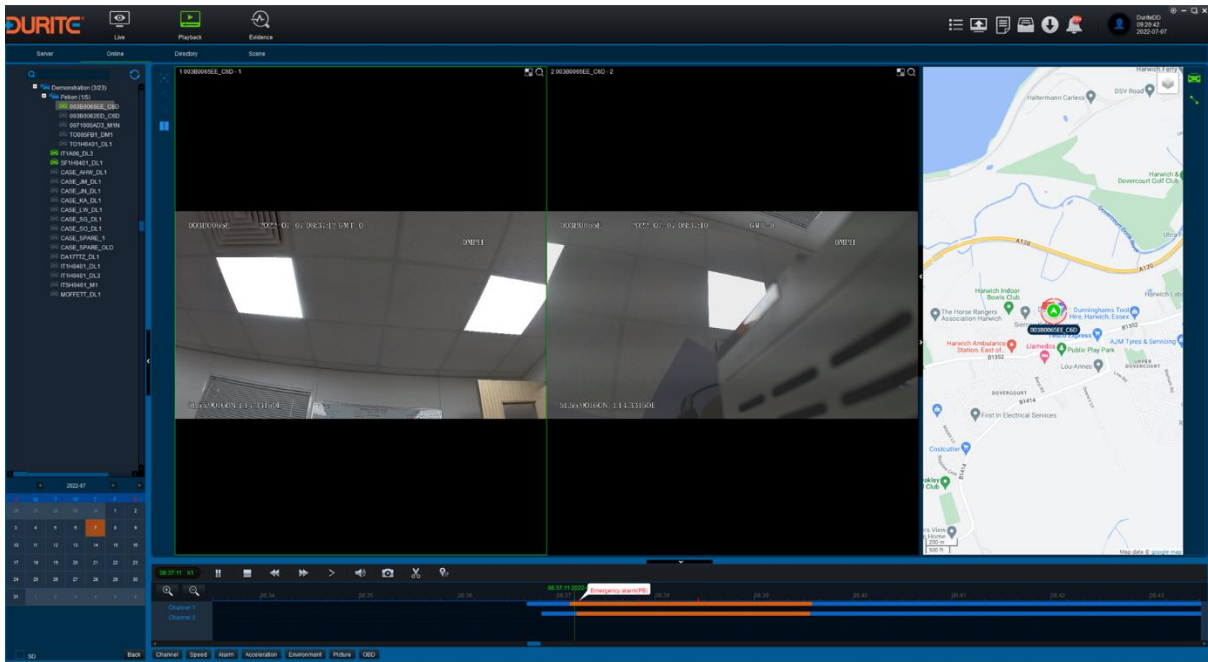
